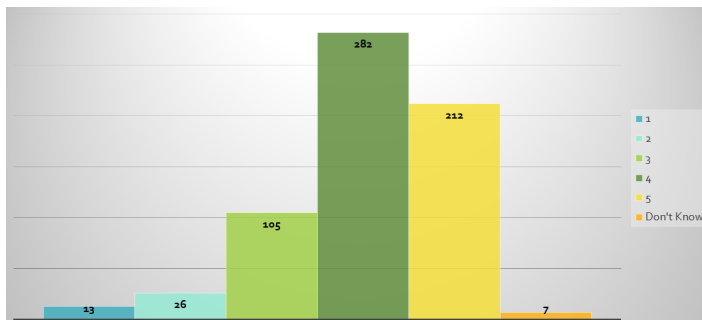
Citizen Satisfaction Survey

Earlier this year, the City provided citizens with the opportunity to fill out a satisfaction survey. A total of 645 surveys were received, 426 paper copies and 219 electronic surveys, approximately 14% of the number sent out. Various services provided by the City were ranked from 1 to 5, one being the least favorable and five the best. I have provided just a few of the results here, the results of the entire survey can be found at www.eldoks.com.

We are happy to share that over 75% of respondents gave a score of 4 or higher when asked how satisfied they were with the overall quality of services provided by the City.

Overall Quality of Services Provided by the City



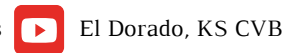
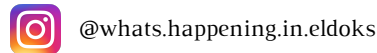
The survey also provided a space for each respondent to choose items which they thought the City should put the most emphasis on. These included: maintenance of city streets and sidewalks; ease of travel on major roads; ease of pedestrian travel; crime prevention; visibility of police; debris, mowing and exterior maintenance of residential properties; and the condition of parks, the pool and park restrooms. Staff discussed these items with the City Commission at the April 10th work session and were directed to continue reviewing the results and discuss ways to use the information to enhance the services provided by the City.

One of the many items of note in the survey was communication. Many respondents stated that they weren't aware of various programs, events and other services provided by the City. We hope that we will be able to provide better and more

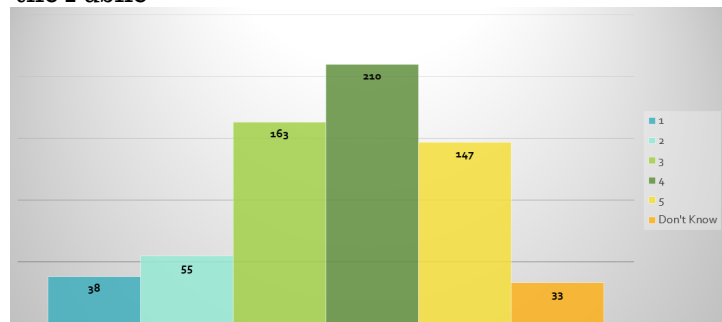

#GrassClippings

Did you know there is an ordinance against putting grass clippings and leaves in the street? Municipal Code Section 13.02.030 states that no one shall dump or discharge any garbage, rubbish or yard waste into the storm sewer system.

To correct this problem when mowing, point the blower towards the yard while near the curb. Choose the mulch option if your mower has the ability to mulch. Should grass get in the roadway, you can also sweep or use a blower to blow it back up in the yard.

The city also has an ordinance prohibiting grass on the sidewalk that can be found in Section 12.08.050 of the Municipal Code. In addition to grass, it is also illegal to place or deposit on public streets, sidewalks or alleys, any dirt, filth, sewage, sweepings, excrement, compost, papers, garbage, stable manure, boxes, ashes, lumber, coal, wood, kindling, grass, weeds, vegetables, slops or litter of any kind, except in approved containers for removal.

You're probably asking yourself "Why can't we just let the rain wash it down the storm sewer?" When grass clippings and leaves get into the roadway they can clog the inlets and cause flooding across roadways and in yards. Flooding can damage roadways and disguise dangerous obstacles for drivers or pedestrians.

City Animal Licenses

Each resident of El Dorado that owns a dog or a cat must license those pets with the City. Animals must have a current rabies vaccination in order to be registered. Pet owners may obtain the vaccination from any licensed veterinarian in the city. Licenses for sterilized animals are \$5.00 per year, while non-sterilized animals are \$40.00 per year. Monthly fees apply to those registering after February 28th.

For your convenience, licenses may also be purchased at the Animal Shelter located at 222 E. Locust Ave. or El Dorado City Hall, located at 220 E. 1st Ave. (walk up window only), and at many local veterinarians offices throughout El Dorado.

No farm animals such as roosters, geese, ducks or exotic pets such as constrictor snakes or rear fang snakes are allowed. Residents may have up to six chickens within the city limits.

All pet owners are required to:

- Provide rabies vaccinations for their pet(s).
- Purchase current license(s) and keep them on your pet(s).
- Keep your pet(s) confined on your property at all times, except to exercise or walk, at which time you must have complete control of the pet. If your animal defecates on any property other than your private property, you must clean it up.
- Provide your pet(s) with proper veterinary care, food, water and proper shelter from the weather.

The dog park is located at 321 E. Locust Ave., which offers a safe environment for your dog to get lots of exercise and play without being on a leash.

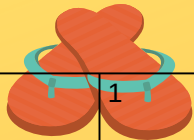

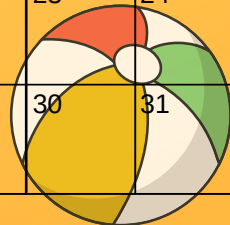
